Southern Forest Economics Workshop (official)
Southern Forest Economics Workers (informal)

It is an organization that brings together representatives of industry, consulting, academia, and federal and state agencies to discuss current issues in the economics of forestry, timber markets, timberland investments, and forest products trade.

SOFEW meeting in 1977

Location: Gulf Shores, Alabama

Date: April 6-7, 1977

Registrants: 123

When was the first meeting?

1960s; 6 southern forest economists

Meeting summary: 1977—2013

37 years between 1977 and 2013

Locations: 12 southern states

Survey: results and limitations

Results: positive; an average of 4.0 out of 5.0

Limitations:

- Meeting attendees only
- Participation rate less than 50%
- A small truncated sample

B. ISFRE - What is going on now?

International Society of Forest Resource Economics

A new name since November 2013

Motivation for changes

Declining and fluctuating numbers of attendees

- 60 to 130 attendees
- 40 to 65 presentations

Cannot reach a breakeven point for some (e.g., a loss of > \$5,000 in one meeting)

How to have more attendees?

Two directions for a new organization:

- Expand the scope of forest economics
- Expand the geographical coverage

Benefits of a new name

- A more diverse group of attendees from different regions of the U.S. and other countries
- A more diverse audience
- A clearer identification of the focus and image
- New meeting locations in other regions or countries
- More interactions between academia, industry, and government

Scope

Expanding the geographical coverage of the organization is more appealing to most members.

Natural resources or environmental economics are not in the new name for a better focus.

Integration and cooperation

Western Forest Economists (WFE)

European forest economists

Asian forest economists

- Over 400 professionals in China
- 5th Faustmann Symposium, Beijing, Oct. 2015
- A possible meeting of ISFRE at Beijing in 2016

Possible integration with WFE

Three scenarios:

- Complete integration and merge
- Separate as we have been
- Separate but hosting a joint meeting first
 - Need a decision by mid-summer
 - Location: Portland, Oregon?
 - Host
